Thought for the week.

From the Rector

What does it look like when we have been touched by God? What allows us to have confidence that God is with us? Today, when we focus on the Transfiguration, we hear three stories that all relate to how we can see that one has been in the presence of God.

The Transfiguration is a powerful image. Luke's disciples need a revelatory experience to appreciate Jesus' identity and vocation. In Luke's gospel this event has a distinctive interpretation of Jesus' death and resurrection. The transfiguration provides the apocalyptic component of what is to come. Earlier, Jesus came from a time of prayer to ask his disciples how they understood his identity. The transfiguration will also follow a moment of intimate prayer.

Prayer is at the heart of the time we spend in the presence of God. Today we hear how those who return from God's presence 'glow'. It may challenge us to consider how our time of prayer radiates God's presence to those around us. Equally, as we prepare for the start of Lent this week, we are invited like the disciples to ponder what we have seen; and how it informs the journey to Easter we are on.

Baptism today. In the 10am service today, we celebrate the baptism of Eloise Grace Lindbeck, daughter of Katherine and grandchild of Judith and Rob Lindbeck. Family, friends and parishioners are invited for refreshments after the Service.
